



LGBT and Related Movie Titles: Presence and Statistics (2015–2025)

Trends in LGBT Representation

- **Proportion of LGBT-Inclusive Movies:**

- In 2022, LGBTQ representation in major studio releases peaked at 28.5%, with 100 out of 350 movies featuring at least one LGBTQ character, according to GLAAD's Studio Responsibility Index^[1].
- This dropped to 27.3% in 2023 (70 of 256 films)^[2], and further to 23.6% in 2024^{[3] [4]}.
- Modern statistics show 28% of major studio films include an LGBTQ+ character, but more than half have very limited presence^[5].

- **Character Diversity and Screen Time:**

- Of 292 LGBTQ characters in 2022's films: 40% were people of color, 163 were men, 119 were women, and 10 were nonbinary^[1].
- Transgender characters remain rare (12 films in 2022; only 2 in 2023 and 2024)^{[1] [4] [2]}.
- About 27–38% of LGBTQ characters enjoyed over 10 minutes of screen time as of recent years^{[1] [2] [4]}.

Key Points

- The number of LGBTQ-themed films and characters has increased over the past decade, with record highs in 2022, but since then, there has been a decline in proportion and depth of representation^{[1] [4] [3] [2]}.
- Transgender and disabled LGBTQ characters are still the least represented, and screen time for LGBTQ characters has fluctuated but remains limited in most cases^{[4] [2] [1]}.
- The variety of stories—ranging from romance to drama and historical—to contemporary settings has steadily expanded, as seen in recent releases and upcoming titles for 2025^{[8] [9]}.

Generational Consumption

- 85% of LGBTQ millennials reported watching LGBTQ-inclusive TV or movies in the past year, indicating strong audience engagement and demand for representation^[10].

Over the past ten years, representation for LGBTQ stories in cinema has seen both significant advances and setbacks, with a growing catalog of notable films and ongoing scrutiny regarding the quality and depth of their portrayal^{[3] [4] [2] [1] [6] [7] [8] [9]}.

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LGBTQ Movie Representation Trends (2014–2023)

General Overview & Key Statistics

- **Representation Peaked, Then Declined:** In 2022, LGBTQ representation in major studio releases peaked with 100 out of 350 films (28.5%) featuring at least one LGBTQ character. But this percentage dropped to 27.3% in 2023 (70 out of 256 films), and further declined to 23.6% in 2024 (59 out of 250 films)^{[13] [14] [15]}.
- **LGBTQ Character Counts:**
 - 2023: 170 LGBTQ characters, notably 46% were people of color (a 6% increase from 2022)^{[13] [15]}.
 - 2022: 292 LGBTQ characters, with record representation, including 13 transgender characters^{[13] [16]}.
 - By 2023, only **two transgender characters** appeared (down from 13 in 2022), and disabled LGBTQ representation also fell from 11 to just two characters^{[15] [13]}.
- **Speaking Roles Proportion:** In 2022, LGBTQ characters constituted 2.1% of all speaking or named roles in top-grossing U.S. films. Of these, five were transgender and four were in the film *Bros* (2022)^[16].
- **Screen Time:** In 2023, 38% of LGBTQ characters had more than 10 minutes of screen time—an increase compared to previous years^[15].

Diversity & Quality

- **Rise in Bisexual Representation:** Bisexual character inclusion in 2023 was 27%, up by 1% from 2022 ^[15].
- **Trans Representation Remains Critically Low and Often Problematic:** Despite a peak in 2022, trans narratives declined sharply, and many recent portrayals relied on stereotypes or cis actors playing trans roles, which drew criticism ^[13].
- **Distributor Ratings:** Most major studios received "poor" or "insufficient" grades for inclusivity by GLAAD in recent years. Independent and mid-size studios like A24 and Amazon have shown better (though still mixed) scores on inclusivity ^{[13] [14] [15]}.

Narrative Trends & Notable Films

- **Inclusion Progress:** The last decade witnessed a gradual increase in LGBTQ leads, especially in independent and award-winning films. Hollywood blockbusters still lag behind in authentic and nuanced representation ^{[16] [17]}.
- **Genre Shifts:** Diversity in genres—from romantic comedies (*Bros*, 2022), dramas (*All of Us Strangers*, 2023), to documentaries and indie films—reflects a broader storytelling landscape ^{[17] [18]}.
- **Notable Titles:**
 - *Bros* (2022)—high profile inclusion of transgender characters and predominantly LGBTQ+ cast ^[16].
 - *All of Us Strangers*, *Unicorns*, and *Passages* (2023)—center queer romance and identity, and received critical acclaim ^{[17] [18]}.

Summary of Trends

- LGBTQ movie presence increased gradually from 2014, peaking around 2022, but a decline in quantity and diversity followed in 2023.
- Trans and disabled LGBTQ representation remain the least visible, despite occasional landmark advances.
- Mainstream Hollywood studios lag behind indie and streaming platforms.
- Growing representation of people of color and bisexual characters signals progress in some areas.

LGBTQ storytelling and representation in film continues to evolve, with authentic voices increasingly entering mainstream and indie cinema—even as setbacks and challenges persist ^{[13] [15] [16] [17] [18]}.

Comparison of LGBTQ Themes in Hollywood vs Indie Films

Hollywood (Major Studios)

- **Characterization & Screen Time:**
 - Hollywood films have often favored minor or token LGBTQ characters, frequently relegating them to stereotypical or supporting roles. GLAAD found, for example, that in major studio releases, 56% of queer characters appeared for less than three minutes and 21% for less than one minute. Only nine of 22 LGBTQ-inclusive films in 2018 offered a queer character more than ten minutes of screen time^[23] ^[24] ^[25].
 - Major studios have shown recent declines: Only 23.6% of Hollywood films in 2024 (top 10 distributors) featured LGBTQ characters, and representation has dropped for two consecutive years after peaking in 2022 at 28.5%^[25] ^[26] ^[27].
- **Themes & Approach:**
 - Stories often aim for broad market appeal, resulting in more sanitized, less nuanced portrayals. Representation is often motivated by commercial interests, resulting in more cautious storytelling and a reluctance to center films on LGBTQ characters or complex issues^[28] ^[29].
 - Trans, nonbinary, and disabled queer characters are particularly rare in mainstream releases^[30] ^[25].
- **Studio Scores:**
 - Most large distributors received "insufficient" or "poor" ratings for inclusivity (according to GLAAD's Studio Responsibility Index). In contrast, only studios like A24 (often classified as "indie" despite wider distribution) earned high inclusivity marks^[25] ^[31].

Indie Films

- **Characterization & Depth:**
 - Indie films are recognized for creating more complex, authentic, and multidimensional LGBTQ characters—often as leads rather than sidekicks, and avoiding common stereotypes^[28] ^[23].
 - Storylines frequently delve into lived experiences, focusing on emotional, social, and political challenges, intersectionality, and less-explored identities.
- **Thematic Exploration:**
 - Indie films address a broader range of queer experiences, including alternative relationships, polyamory, and nontraditional family structures, which are rarely depicted in the mainstream^[24].
 - Notable indie films with rich LGBTQ themes include *Moonlight*, *Call Me by Your Name*, *Portrait of a Lady on Fire*, *The Favourite*, and *Can You Ever Forgive Me?* These films are often lauded for authenticity, artistry, and emotional resonance rather than commercial performance^[28] ^[23].
- **Critical Acclaim vs Visibility:**

- Indie films routinely receive more public accolades for representation quality but may go under the radar for general audiences due to lower promotional budgets and distribution^[28].
